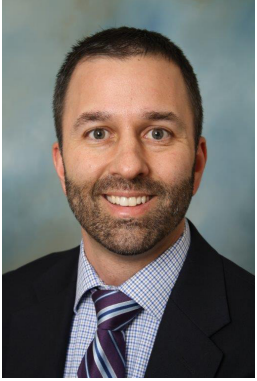




River Valley Nursing Center 2013 Annual Report

Services Offered:

- Blood pressure and blood glucose screening
- Pregnancy test verification
- Medical follow-up for diabetes, hypertension, post-surgical procedures, ER visits, etc
- Medication review/education
- Health Promotion education
- Case management
- Annual Free flu vaccine clinics in Scott & Carver Counties
- Assistance with Applications for Government Programs (Food stamps, medical assistance, etc.)

Client Story

A young woman came to our Nursing Center to have her pregnancy confirmed. Although she knew she was pregnant, she wanted to get a health professional to confirm it. She had visited us before and stated she felt she had gotten good information for other services for her family; thus her return. The next visit she came with her 5 children who were all sick. She had no health insurance, but the RVNC nurse felt they should be seen by a medical provider. After making a call to an Allina Clinic (Dean's Lake) to see if fees could be waived until she gets her health insurance papers, the financial person at the clinic talked to the River Valley nurse and told her the fee would be waived for all 5 of the children. All children were seen at the clinic and care provided.
